

Fully vaccinated travellers will not require any pre-departure tests (PDT) to enter Singapore

1. All fully vaccinated travellers entering Singapore will no longer need to take a pre-departure test (PDT) from 0001hrs, 26 April 2022. The removal of the pre-departure test requirement also applies to non-fully vaccinated children aged 12 and below.

2. Accepted COVID-19 Vaccinations for Entry

All travellers aged 12 and below do not need to be vaccinated for entry to Singapore. Travellers aged 13 and above are only considered "fully vaccinated" for purposes of entry to Singapore if they meet either of the following conditions at least 2 weeks before arrival in Singapore, if not they are considered "non-fully vaccinated":

i. Received the full regimen of WHO EUL Vaccines in the list of accepted vaccinations <u>below</u> and met the minimum dose interval period; or



- ii. Contracted COVID-19 before being vaccinated, and received at least one dose of any WHO EUL Vaccines (<u>listed below</u>) at least 28 days after their first diagnosis of a COVID-19 infection. (E.g. If traveller was first diagnosed with COVID-19 on 1 April, the vaccination should only be taken from 29 April onwards) Travellers must produce acceptable proof of their first positive COVID-19 diagnosis.
- iii. Proof of vaccination is preferably via digitally verifiable means (QR code) for faster arrival processing. Non-digital (paper-based) printed certificates are also accepted.

3. Non-fully Vaccinated Travellers

This is for all travellers, including Singapore Citizens and Permanent Residents, aged 13 and above (i.e. born before 2010) who are:

- Not considered fully vaccinated against COVID-19 with WHO EUL vaccines*; OR
- Certified medically ineligible for COVID-19 vaccination

Entry permissions are not required for Singapore Citizens and Permanent Residents as well as Long-Term Pass holders (including In-Principle Approval holders) aged 13 to 17.

Non-fully vaccinated Short-Term Visitors aged 13 and above, all other non-fully vaccinated Long-Term Pass holders aged 18 and above are not allowed to enter Singapore.

Only the following non-fully vaccinated travellers may apply for entry approval via the channels listed below:

- Family Members of a Singapore Citizen/Permanent Resident, including adopted child holding a Dependant's Pass In-Principle Approval;
 - At least 4 days before the desired date of entry, apply for entry via the <u>SafeTravel Office</u> <u>Application Portal</u>
- Holders of Permanent Resident In-Principle Approval (IPA) or ICA Long-Term Visit Pass IPA Aged 18 and Above;
 - At least 4 days before the desired date of entry, apply for entry via the <u>SafeTravel Office</u> Application Portal
- MOE or MOM Long-Term Pass Holders Aged 18 and Above who are Medically Ineligible for Vaccines;

Student's Pass (STP), STP In-Principle Approval Holders and their Eligible Immediate Family Members

- Applications must be submitted at least 1 week before the desired date of entry using this application form.

Long-Term Pass Issued by MOM

- <u>Submit an exemption request before entry</u>. Request is subject to approval. Visit the <u>MOM</u> website for more details.
- Short-term Visitors Entering for Exceptional reasons (e.g. tend to critically ill family, or death of family member)

Entry request should be submitted <u>using this form</u>, with the relevant supporting documents (e.g. doctor's memo, death certificate) to facilitate processing.

4. Entry for Sea Crew

Fully vaccinated foreign Sea Crew can enter Singapore without submitting an undertaking to MPA or ICA. If they are not fully vaccinated, they will continue to:

- 1. Submit to MPA an undertaking via this link, for having:
 - a. Taken a pre-departure test within 2 days before arrival in Singapore; and



- b. Completed quarantine in their home country for at least 7 days before arrival.
- 2. Submit the following types of applications to ICA via digitalPORT@SG:
 - Arrival or departure immigration clearance of vessel and crew
 - Crew sign-on or sign-off
 - Transfer of crew from one vessel to another
 - Extension of stay of crew

5. SG Arrival Card

Fill SG Arrival (SGAC) Card up to 3 days before arrival

It is **mandatory** for all passengers, including Singapore Citizens & Singapore PR, seeking to enter Singapore to submit their <u>SG Arrival Card (SGAC)</u> within 3 days before their arrival in Singapore, as they will receive an email acknowledgement, which they can present for smoother pre-boarding and immigration checks **upon completion of SGAC.**

Passengers must be requested to show his or her SGAC acknowledgement email at check-in, as it will indicate the documents that airlines must check (remarks column) to allow boarding.

6. Immigration Clearance in Singapore

Follow the instructions of officers and signage on arrival for the appropriate clearance lanes, and provide all documents, including proof of vaccination, and information required by the immigration officer.

Upon clearance, an e-Pass (i.e. Visit Pass) stating the period of stay granted will be issued to foreign short-term visit pass travellers via the email address indicated in the SGAC. **Passports will no longer be stamped.**

If you are symptomatic on arrival, you may be directed to take a COVID-19 test. Each Antigen Rapid Test (ART) administered will cost S\$30, while each COVID-19 Polymerase Chain Reaction Test (PCR Test) will cost S\$138.
