Australia Travel Declaration - web

The Australian Government introduced the Australia Travel Declaration for travellers to Australia to help with management of COVID-19. Since 9 December 2020, all travellers (excepting flight crew, people on military flights, people arriving by sea and foreign diplomats) are expected to complete the Australia Travel Declaration.

The Australia Travel Declaration collects information from travellers before departure to Australia. The information collected includes their flight details, quarantine requirements (if required), health status, contact details and vaccination status.

What does it look like?

Travellers can access the Australia Travel Declaration (web version) through a link provided on the Australia Travel Declaration page <https://covid19.homeaffairs.gov.au/australia-travel-declaration> on the Home Affairs website.

The Australia Travel Declaration collects your contact details in Australia, flight details, quarantine requirements and your health status. This information helps the Australian Government manage contact tracing and quarantine planning to ensure the health and safety of the Australian community.

How does it work


Travel declarations explained

Every traveller entering Australia should complete an Australia Travel Declaration 72 hours before they travel. The successful submission of your declaration does not guarantee entry into Australia. This service is operated by SITA which is authorised by the Australian Government to collect declarations on their behalf.

The bottom of the page has additional information about making your Australia Travel Declaration



Within the landing page, the traveller can access the privacy notice, contact information and commence their declaration. After logging in, the first screen requests the traveller to provide personal and trip details.

SUBMIT CANCEL

Once the traveller has completed their travel declaration, they will receive an email that acknowledges the submission of their declaration. Information on their declaration will also be stored in their account for later retrieval. The completed Australia Travel Declaration (email and online) includes a risk outcome status that airlines can use to identify travellers eligible for green zone flights.

There are three possible categories for travellers:

- Green, (also displays with a tick) - The answers provided by the traveller indicate they meet the current entry requirements for quarantine-free status. The message for a green status is shown below.

However, states and territories may require you to self-isolate at home and undertake additional COVID-19 testing. These requirements may vary so you need to check the requirements on australia.gov.au/quarantine closer to your arrival.

- Blue, (also displays with an hourglass) - The answers provided by the traveller indicate they do not meet the criteria for quarantine free status. They will need to quarantine (this includes home-based quarantine) when they arrive in Australia. The message for a blue status is shown below.

- Red, (also displays with a cross) - The answers provided by the traveller indicate they are a health risk or will not comply with Australian testing and quarantine requirements.

If they are able to board the flight to Australia, their quarantine needs will be assessed on arrival. The message for a red status is shown below.

Your responses indicate you may present a risk to public health. If you try to board your flight, you may be denied by your airline. Please contact your airline or travel operator about your travel arrangements.

If your airline allows you to board, you may need to quarantine on arrival in Australia. You should check the requirements on australia.gov.au/quarantine closer to your arrival.
