



What is new, what is different –update 14 December 21

Changes have been made to the Australia Travel Declaration (ATD) on 10 December and 14 December. These changes:

- Update the landing page and the privacy statement to reflect recent Department of Health legislation changes
- Update the wording in the ATD outcomes
- Provide additional clarification to a number of questions in the ATD

The main ATD landing page has been updated to emphasis the importance of health testing in the traveller's journey



Both the privacy statement and the important notice in the ATD have been updated to reflect recent Department of Health legislative changes. The changes:

- Emphasis the mandatory nature of declarations in the ATD
- Reinforce consequences for not providing responses to the declarations in the ATD

After submitting their ATD a traveller receives an outcome based upon their responses. The three possible outcomes have all been updated. The updated outcomes are:

Your responses indicate that you meet the requirements for a quarantine-free arrival into Australia where permitted by the jurisdiction of your arrival.

However, states and territories may require you to self-isolate at home and undertake additional COVID-19 testing. Currently, you are required to undertake a COVID-19 PCR test within 24 hours of arrival and again on day 6 after your arrival. These requirements may vary so you need to check the requirements on australia.gov.au/quarantine closer to your arrival.

The COVID-19 Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) test must be taken 72 hours or less before you depart for Australia.
